General Information about Graduation

Parents, would you please go over the following information with your son or daughter. The P.L.U.S. officer has spoken about this during class and the two biggest issues the students have are; 1) having to *dress up*, and 2) wearing *tennis shoes* with nice clothes. The shoe issue is a safety issue involving students going up and down stairs, onto and off a stage they are not use to while being very excited, and in addition the noise caused by hard soled shoes. Your support with these requests are appreciated.

1) **Proper Student Attire:**

- Please dress up more than you would for school. No need to wear a dress or suit, but you should be looking nice.
- The following is a list of apparel you **are not allowed to wear***:
 - **No Blue Jeans** (Black jeans, Green jeans, Red jeans, etc. are okay but not recommended)
 - **No Shorts, Knickers or Pipe Pants** ("Skorts" or "Culottes" are okay as long as they do not look like shorts).
 - **No Sports Jerseys, Muscle shirts or Tank Tops. No T-shirts** exposed to the outside (Boys - shirt with a collar / Girls - blouse without a collar is okay).
 - **No Sweat shirts, Sweat pants, Work out suits, Nylon Parachute pants or Jogging suits.**
 - **No clothing with Holes.**
 - No clothes or jewelry **representing Drugs** in any manner.
 - * *Any of the above clothing can get you dismissed from the graduation.*
- **Shoes:** The best shoes you can wear are **tennis shoes or soft-soled shoes**. They are safe, quiet and comfortable. Please do not wear **high heels** or shoes with hard soles. They are slippery, dangerous and make too much noise.

2) Behavior

- Our graduation is like a Pep-rally/Graduation combined. There are times when the children must listen as well as times to yell and cheer. Caution: we do not want the students to get into "competition" with other schools to see who can make the most noise.
- The students will know when it's appropriate to cheer and when they need to listen. Please pay attention.

3) Arrival for Graduation

- Students will need to be at the graduation **location** $\frac{1}{2}$ **hr.** before the graduation is scheduled to begin.
- Students will go to the assigned area and **stay there** with their class.
- The teachers will line up students in alphabetical order according to class and that is how they will enter the graduation.

4) Parent Evaluation - *We will be asking parents to evaluate our P.L.U.S. program.*

- Upon your arrival at the graduation find an evaluation form at an entrance door.
- Please fill out the evaluation while you are waiting for the graduation to begin.
- There will be boxes at the pick-up locations for you to leave your completed evaluations.
- These evaluations will help us make P.L.U.S. a better program for the youth of Lake County.

All of the P.L.U.S. Officers, and I would like to thank you for the help and support shown through the homework assignments you completed with your children. I hope that as each assignment came along the discussions with your child grew more interesting.
