

# Contracts approved for equipment and services

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**LAKE COUNTY** — The Lake County Board of Commissioners passed two separate resolutions approving contracts for the Lake County Crime Laboratory and the Lake County Recorder's Office at the Oct. 8 meeting.

The first resolution approved a contract with Edax, Inc. for the purchase of a micro x-ray fluorescence analyzer for the Lake County Crime Laboratory.

"This piece of equipment that we're going to purchase uses x-rays and helps us in the analysis of clandestine labs, meth labs, the analysis of glass and paint in crimes," said David Green, a criminalist at the Crime Lab.

This \$170,000 purchase replaces 14-year-old equipment which was not usable.

"For public information, all expenses, all operations of the Lake County Crime Laboratory are funded by a special purpose levy that's been approved by the voters," Board President Dan Troy said.

The second resolution authorized execution of a contract between the Lake County Recorder's Office and Fidar Technologies, Inc. for record scanning services.

"We have recently gone online with our document images," said Recorder Ann Radcliffe. "Our indexing system is called Laredo and it goes from 1986 to current,

however, our document images on Laredo from the middle of 1991 to current."

For that reason, people still need to call for copies of images prior to mid-1991 and send a check to get them.

Fidar will provide digital scanning services for the items from 1986 to mid-1991 for an amount not to exceed \$46,864.54, and proprietary digital enhancement services for an amount not to exceed \$61,318.46.
