- Authorizing advertising for bids for organic polyelectrolytes (polymer) with a bid opening date of June 11.

- Increasing appropriations for Mentor Marsh Sanitary Interceptor 336S and transferring cash.

- Increasing appropriations for LCDU Sewer District contract repairs and Beidler Road Waterline Replacement 339W other expenses.

- Awarding a bid to Classic Chevrolet in Mentor for Lake County general fleet vehicle repairs and maintenance.

Board President Dan Troy said arranging for vehicle maintenance with private businesses made sense since the county had reduced employees and the number of vehicles, which had extended warranties, it did not make fiscal sense to continue maintaining the vehicle maintenance center that was in North Perry. It was recently sold to the Lake County Ohio Port and Economic Development

Authority, which leased it out.

- Awarding a bid to Classic GMC in Painesville for Lake County Sheriff's Office fleet vehicle repairs and maintenance.

- Dissolving the Lake County Residential Building Code Appeals Board and designating authority to the county administrator or the county administrator's designee to hear and adjudicate appeals of the determinations issued by the residential building official.

The board was dissolved because it was unnecessary and there have not been any members of that board since 1995.
