

Waterline breaks reported at Pine Hill in Concord

CONCORD TOWNSHIP—Trustee Chris Galloway reported a resident of Pine Hill had called about waterline breaks at the June 20 meeting.

“We will need to pursue (them) with Lake County (Department of Utilities) as it relates to any intentions they have on that line,” he said. “In the last year or two I’ve had to deal with a number of water line breaks ... that have been destructive so I will get with Lee (Bodnar, administrator) on that issue.”

Galloway said they will go to the area and see if they can determine what some of the issues might be.

“We maintain the area out there,” said George Ginnis, water superintendent for Painesville.

He said the city maintains about 140 miles of water mains and average 40 to 60 breaks a year.

“I think we just had two there this year,” Ginnis said. “As soon as the break happens, we send a crew out to make repairs immediately (so the breaks have been repaired.)”

In other business:

• The Concord Township Fire Department was presented with a special plaque at the June 20 meeting.

“We presented them with a stove and the stove is dedicated to Curt Bauer who was a cook over there for Concord Community Days for many years and unfortunately came to an untimely end in an accident,” said Dave Breaux, president of Concord Community Days.

• Fiscal Officer Amy L. Dawson said the 2010-2011 audits had been completed and would be available for public viewing following state acceptance.

• Boy Scout Max Magid proposed a community project so he could earn his Eagle Scout award.

His troop had already helped with preparation of the community garden, but he would like to build two benches and an additional two raised beds at the community garden and two more at the Community Center.

• Trustees approved placing a replacement 2.7-mill fire levy on the November ballot and hiring Justin Dynes and Michael Hogya as full-time seasonal workers at \$10 per hour.

The next regular meeting of the trustees will be at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday, July 18.
