LAKE COUNTY - Lake County Commissioners Bob Aufuldish, Dan Troy and Ray Sines meet at 10 a.m. most Thursdays, with some meetings at 2 p.m. on Tuesdays, in the Commissioners' Chambers on the fourth floor of the Lake County Administration Building, 105 Main St., Painesville.

There was a meeting Jan. 24. The next meeting will be Thursday, Jan. 31 at 10 a.m.

At the Jan. 15 meeting, the following resolutions were adopted:

UTILITIES DEPARTMENT

- Resolution establishing a fund to be known as Glyco I Force Main Replacement Phase II 346s with various revenue and appropriation

lines and transferring cash.

- Resolution reclassifying Michael Pegoraro to the position of laborer III.

COMMISSIONERS' OFFICE

- Resolution authorizing execution of a subrecipient agreement with the city of Willoughby Hills for the sanitary sewer connection program utilizing Community Development Block Grant funds.

- Resolution authorizing execution of a professional services agreement on behalf of the Lake County Emergency Management Agency and Barbara M. Pizzi for radiological emergency response planning, effective through Jan. 31, 2014.

The resolution authorizes an option to extend last year's contract.

FirstEnergy Nuclear Operating Company (FENOC) will again provide a \$30,000 grant for the cost of the contract.

- Resolution authorizing execution of a professional planning services agreement on behalf of the Lake County Office of Planning and Com-

munity Development and Ashtabula County Board of Commissioners in an amount not to exceed \$7,500.

Ashtabula County Commissioners requested the agreement since their county no longer has the personnel needed to administer subdivisions and land use and zoning reviews.

- Resolution amending the agreement on behalf of the Lake County Stormwater Management Division and Madison Township for regional waterways maintenance.

Due to the good weather in 2012, additional work was done by Madison Township so the amendment needs to be increased from \$80,000 to \$93,389.62.

- Resolution authorizing execution of a sub-grant award agreement (#2012-PC-NFS-7802) in the amount of \$9,645.50 on behalf of the Lake County Crime Laboratory and the Office of Criminal Justice Services, effective through Dec. 31.

- Resolution approving

payment of bills in the amount of \$805,980.64.

- Resolution approving purchase orders in the amount of \$444,623.61.

- Resolution increasing appropriations for various general, and non general fund accounts.

The Lake County Port Authority has also decided to join the county plan with about five employees.
