

2013 CONSERVATION TREE SEEDLING SALE

SINGLE-SPECIES PACKETS The following species are available in quantities of 10, 25 or 50 of each species.

WHITE PINE: These conifers will grow quickly, if not densely, to form a privacy screen or windbreak, and will do well in many soil types.

RED CEDAR: The red cedar can be trained to form a hedge or planted as a windbreak, and will provide food and shelter to wildlife.

CANADIAN HEMLOCK: Hemlocks love shade and moist, well-drained soils. The glossy, dark green needles are great for creating year-round understory in a young forest, or for creating a little privacy in a shady area.

RED OSIER DOGWOOD: This multi-stemmed shrub will be at home in a wet part of your yard or along a streambank. It will put on a show of white flowers in the spring, white fruits in the fall, and display its namesake red bark in the winter

BLACK CHERRY: The clusters of white flowers on this important timber species are popular with the insects and the small, dark fruits are a favorite of songbirds. This tree has potential to become very tall.

BLACK WALNUT: A valuable hardwood for establishing a wildlife planting or a timber plot, the black walnut is known for outcompeting other plants around it. It is great for reforesting open fields.

RED OAK: A great tree for attracting wildlife, and also a valuable timber tree. Red oak can be very fast growing in full sun conditions but does not do well in shade.

SYCAMORE: A tall, fast-growing tree with spreading branches and white bark, commonly found along river bottoms, the sycamore is great for creating shade in wet soils and stabilizing the shores of streams and ponds.

SUGAR MAPLE: This species will allow you to take up maple sugaring while waiting for your woodlot to mature, or you can just sit back and enjoy the spectacular fall colors.

MIXED PACKETS

SPRING FLOWERING TREES PACKET These trees are small, well-behaved, and will add spring color to your yard. They also provide food and shelter to wildlife. One order will include three of each species, or nine trees total.

SERVICEBERRY: This narrow, upright tree is popular with the birds in the summer and the spring pollinators will enjoy the apple-like flowers.

WHITE-FLOWERING DOGWOOD: A small tree known for its large, white spring flowers and red berries and purple foliage in the fall.

REDBUD: This tree won't tower over your house, but it should put on a show of pink blossoms in spring. Tolerates droughty soils but prefers moist places.

NEW THIS YEAR!

RAIN GARDEN PERENNIALS: This locally-grown mixed flat of perennials will contain 25 plants in 2.5" pots. The species have been selected to do well with occasional wet and dry spells, making them the perfect plants for creating or refreshing a rain garden or naturalizing a wetter part of your yard.

Each flat will include five of each species:

coneflowers (Echinacea)
milkweed (Asclepias)
asters
cardinal flowers (Lobelia)
sedges (Carex)

OTHER OFFERINGS

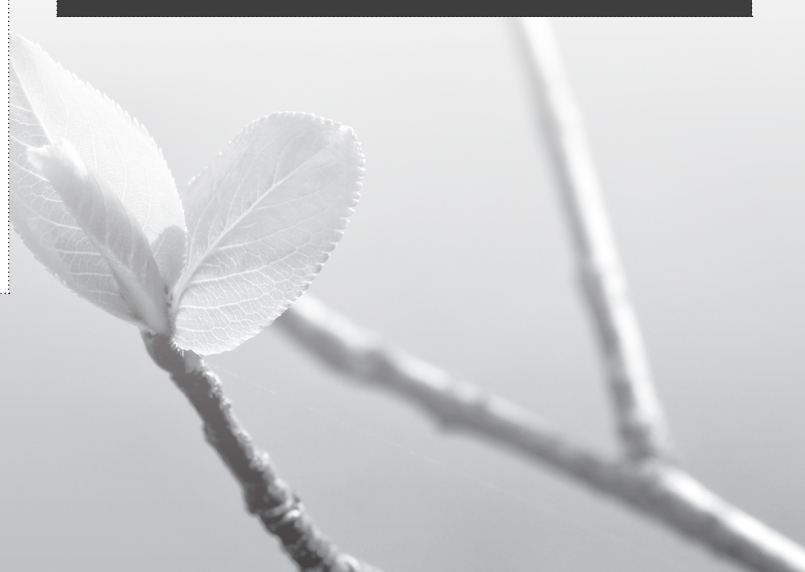
BIRDHOUSES: Bluebird, wren, bat and wood duck/screech owl. The houses come unfinished and ready to hang.

TREE FLAGS: White flags on wire to minimize lawn mower casualties.

All trees are bare-root seedlings between one and three feet tall. Lake County SWCD may substitute similar plant materials if necessary.
