CALL TO ORDER: Commissioner Sines called the meeting to order at 10:03 am, Thursday, February 16, 2012.

ROLL CALL: Upon the roll being called all were present.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES: Upon a motion by Commissioner Troy, seconded by Commissioner Aufuldish, the minutes of the meeting of February 9, 2012, were approved as follows:

OPEN TO THE PUBLIC: Commissioner Sines asked if anyone in the audience wished to address the Board. No one present addressed the Board.

RESOLUTIONS:

1. RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ASSIGNMENT OF AN ENGINEERING AGREEMENT ORIGINALLY EXECUTED WITH THE FLOYD BROWNE GROUP TO ENVIRONMENTAL DESIGN GROUP FOR THE HARDY ROAD WATERLINE PROJECT NO. 323-W (20120216\U01) (UT-4)

- Commissioner Aufuldish and Al Saari, Sanitary Engineer briefly discussed that there has been a corporate restructuring of the Floyd Brown Group and that they have gone back to the Environmental Design Group Akron offices.

2. RESOLUTION DECLARING THE NECESSITY OF AND APPROVING PLANS, SPECIFICATIONS AND ESTIMATES OF COST IN THE AMOUNT OF \$21,000,000 FOR MADISON WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT UPGRADE AND EXPANSION PROJECT NO. 289-S AND ADVERTISING FOR BIDS FOR SAME (Bid Opening: March 28, 2012) (20120216\U02) (UT-8)

Al Saari, Sanitary Engineer: Five to six years ago we started looking at the expansion and upgrade of the Madison treatment plant where the last expansion took place in 1972 over 40 years. The expansion will be from 3 million to 5 million gallons per day, which will be needed to avoid EPA violations. This will be financed through the Ohio Water Department Authority (OWDA) with a favorable floating loan rate of 3.05%. The next resolution will indicate to OWDA that the Lake County Department of Utilities can pay back the loan. We will be raising the benefit user fee for new customers only from \$3.37 to \$5.70, which is the exact same rate as the Mentor Waste Water Sewer District to create uniformity in Lake County. The quarterly rate will be the same across Lake County.

- Commissioner Aufuldish and Al Saari briefly discussed that there will be two phases of funding. One will be the upgrade and one will be the expansion.

- Al Saari briefly discussed the bid package specifications.

Commissioner Troy: This will be the same process that we used for the Mentor plant where we said that any required EPA upgrades will be borne by all existing and future rate payers, and any expansion of the plant would be borne solely by future users. Lake County should be proud that we have two wastewater treatment plants and both have zero discharge of untreated raw waste going into Lake Erie. There are a lot of wastewater treatment systems in this area of the state that cannot make that claim.

UTILITIES: Rick Martin, Director briefly discussed with the Commissioners that Lake County provides a sewer billing service for the City of Willowick and that he recently found out that Willowick has established a flat rate fee for their sewers and this will be in addition to the volumetric rate. This will be quite an increase. Our records indicate Willowick's average customer pays \$72.85 per quarter currently and it will increase to an approximate \$95 per quarter. - Lake County provides water to the City of Willowick and provides a billing service for their sewer charges.

- Brief discussion took place that this rate increase is a decision by the City of Willowick and is not a decision made by Lake County.

- The Utilities Department has requested a statement from Willowick to insert with the billing to inform their customers of this rate increase.
