

THE FACTS:

More than 1 million new cases of basal cell or squamous cell skin cancers (nonmelanoma) occur annually. Most, but not all, of these forms of skin cancer are highly curable. The most serious form of skin cancer is melanoma, which is expected to be diagnosed in nearly 60,000 people in the United States during 2008.

Basal cell and squamous cell cancers (nonmelanoma skin cancers) are highly curable if detected and treated early. Melanoma can spread to other body parts quickly, but early detection greatly increases survival rates.



FREE Skin Cancer Screening

You can sign up for a FREE skin cancer screening. There are no age limits. The dermatologist will check any site on your body – a mole, etc., for skin cancer. You can wear a bathing suit or swim trunks under your clothes.
