

**Corrections/Changes Needed to Five-Year Plan
Lake County (Local Area # 5)**

<u>Page</u>	<u>Description</u>
Various	All references to the Lake County Employment and Training Administration (ETA) should be changed to the Lake County Department of Job and Family Services, Employment & Training Division.
Various	All references to the Lake County Department of Human Services (DHS) should be changed to the Lake County Department of Job and Family Services (DJFS).
Various	All references to the Ohio Bureau of Employment Services (OBES) should be changed to the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services.
17	First paragraph: The Lake County Workforce Investment Board, on April 30, 2002, designated the Lake County Department of Job and Family Services as the One-Stop Operator effective July 1, 2002. Resolution of Lake County Board of Commissioners was passed on June 6, 2002.
17	Second paragraph (status of existing local one-stop system): Lake County has met all of the criteria used by the State of Ohio to assess one-stop service delivery systems in PY 01.
18	Second full paragraph: A Senior Worker Action Program (SWAP) worker is no longer outstationed at the One-Stop center. SWAP, under WIA, no longer has a financial contract to provide services for older workers. SWAP has changed its name to Mature Services.
18	Third full paragraph: Since Lake County ETA is being merged into Lake County DJFS, there is no longer a contract with Lake County ETA for TANF funds.
18	Last paragraph: The case management functions once subcontracted to Auburn Career Center were taken over by Lake County ETA. There is no longer a contract with Auburn; no outstationed Auburn staff.
19	First paragraph: ABLE no longer provides basic skills training in the client learning lab.
19	Second-last paragraph: Cost-sharing agreements are not being negotiated.
20	First paragraph: The Lake County Workforce Investment Board, on April 30, 2002, designated the Lake County Department of Job and Family Services as the One-Stop Operator effective July 1, 2002. Resolution of Lake County Board of Commissioners was passed on June 6, 2002.
20	Second paragraph: Lake County has met all of the criteria used by the State of Ohio to assess one-stop service delivery systems in PY 01.
21	Lake County has MOUs currently in place & is negotiating new ones for PY 02.

25	Second paragraph: Change One-Stop Operator to Lake County DJFS.
27	First bullet paragraph: The One-Stop Operator is now providing all core services.
27	First bullet under "Intensive Services" – should be mandatory intensive services, not mandatory core services.
27	Fourth bullet under "Intensive Services": There is now a definition of self-sufficiency. The Lake County Workforce Investment Board has defined self-sufficiency as a family income of 120% of the Lower Living Standard, as updated annually, for adults, and two-thirds (67%) of the hourly wage at dislocation (which must have taken place within 24 months of registration) for dislocated workers.
28	First bullet: A budget has been developed and the percentage of Title I funds to be allocated for training could be identified.
37	The Lake County Board of Commissioners has passed a resolution to designate Lake County DJFS as fiscal agent effective July 1, 2002. Resolution was passed on June 6, 2002.
39	Entire page discusses method of determining limited funding for training, and priority selection process for clients. New policies and procedures have replaced the description here. The policy applies to total adult funds budgeted for training services provided under ITAs only. The priority system is to be implemented when adult ITA funds which are obligated and/or expended exceed the following levels of funds budgeted (i.e., available) for adult ITAs:

2	First bullet– Jobs for Ohio’s Graduates -Northeast Ohio is no longer a contractor as of June 30, 2001.
2	Second bullet– Auburn no longer provides youth followup; function assumed by Lake County ETA which is merging into Lake County DJFS.
2	Middle of last paragraph – The Lake County WIB is no longer funding a program targeted solely to out-of-school youth.
