MILLION DOLLAR MILESTONE FOR LAKE COUNTY GENERAL FUND

The Lake County Commissioners expect efficiency and transparency with local taxpayer money entrusted to Lake County and the efforts of Recorder Becky Lynch were highlighted during a recent budget hearing with the Board.

Commission President John R. Hamercheck said, "Becky Lynch's proactive budgeting approach and constant communication with the Commissioner's Office continues to be the model for a unified approach when working within the County's budget limits."

At the Board of Commissioners budget Hearing on January 24, 2022 the Recorder program earned accolades from the Lake County Commissioners as she eclipsed a million-dollar milestone by reducing General Fund expenditures through a more efficient use of fees collected and responsible budgeting.

"A thorough operations review was performed and a salary study created in order to establish the specifics related to job duties in the Recorder Department. This study became the cornerstone to developing a technology-salary apportionment. The innovative formula brought to light an active new use for the accumulating balance. Applying this program to Recorder payroll expenses ultimately freed-up much needed resources for the County General Fund,' said County Recorder Becky Lynch.

"I sincerely thank Recorder Lynch and her team for the efficient and effective work flow that has resulted in her ability to return much needed revenue to the County," said Commissioner John Plecnik.

In addition to a vendor refund of \$108,183.00 in 2017, Recorder Lynch's efforts have resulted in a savings in excess of \$1,000,0000 the County General Fund.
