Commissioner Troy stated that this revision is the result of a study performed by Arcadis. The last rate increase for sanitary sewer service in Lake County was in 2011. This increase is about 4.8% and it is necessary because the cost of electricity, materials, labor, and chemicals increased and we need to make sure what is discharged back into the Lake at the highest level of standards possible.

Mr. Rick Martin, Executive Director of the Department of Utilities, replied that is correct and the increase will help keep pace with increased costs and the infrastructure replacement program.

Commissioner Troy stated that any expansions of plants that have been done to handle future customers are financed by tap-in fees for new users so that the existing customers do not pay for the cost of expansion and the people who benefit from the expansion pay for that.

Commissioner Malecek replied that the increase is \$3.57 a quarter.

JOB AND FAMILY SERVICES - Mr. Battiato reported that they anticipate the Governor signing the budget today. One item that will impact them the most is medicaid expansion will remain in place. Commissioner Troy asked if the language about individual case workers for every beneficiary was still in there? Mr. Battiato stated that it is still in there and they do not know how that will play out in terms of their responsibilities.

FINANCE - Mr. Joel DiMare, Budget Director, stated that the tax budget is scheduled to be on the agenda for next week Commissioner's meeting.

OLD BUSINESS: - none

NEW BUSINESS: - Commissioner Troy stated that the Governor has line item veto power regarding the State Budget. They are hopeful he will do something with the change in the tangible personal property tax for utilities in the budget. The indication is that if the budget goes through with that change it will have an impact on local government revenues and rate payers. The good news is there is funding to cover 85% of the cost of electronic poll books is still in the budget and expenditures will be reimbursable. The language regarding 50% reimbursement for public defenders is still in the budget.

Ms. Traci Salkiewicz, County Engineer's Office, gave an update on the temporary Vrooman Road bridge. She stated that the earliest it will be open is next Tuesday, July 7, 2015 because of pavement damage. The damage is in the area around Seeley Road where the material has washed away.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Ms. Becky Lynch, 8040 King Memorial Drive in Mentor, asked if she could get a copy of the contracts for Resolutions #9 and #10 between the Lake County Department of Job and Family Services and the United Labor Agency, Inc. and Various Providers to Offer Services to Eligible Youths through the Workforce Investment Act. Ms. Lynch asked how many various providers there were for Resolution #10?

Mr. Matt Battiato, Job and Family Services Director, replied that they are with OhioGuidestone, Goodwill and Catholic Charities for youth services.

Commissioner Troy stated that these are entities that the Workforce Investment Board has utilized before and they are vetted through the Workforce Investment Board.

Mr. Battiato stated that there is an RFP process and they are vetted by the Workforce Investment Board. Mr. John Muzik, 45 Coventry Drive in Painesville Township, asked exactly where Seeley Road will be vacated? Ms. Salkiewicz explained that it begins up Vrooman Road and heads up the hill when the road becomes gravel. It will go to the east end at the edge of Lake Metroparks' southerly border. Lake Metroparks will then own the road and all parties are in agreement of the vacation.

Commissioner Troy stated that the next regular Commissioners Meeting will be held on Tuesday, July 7, 2015 at 2:00 p.m. and the Commissioners will go into an open session after the executive session today to discuss healthcare issues with EBI representatives.
