Mr. Matt Battiato, Lake County IES Director, explained that this agreement is usually acted upon every few years.

Mr. Matt Battiato, Lake County JFS Director, explained that this agreement is usually acted upon every few years but with the uncertainty surrounding Local Workforce Areas this will be a one year agreement. Lake County still has its own Workforce Investment Area at this point.

Mr. Dan Donaldson, District Administrator of the Lake County Soil & Water Division, explained that this is a resolution in support of a project that they have been working on with the Museum of Natural History that pertains to the western side of the Mentor Marsh. The plan will provide consolidation of management through purchase of property or conservation easements and right-of-entry agreement and a holistic approach to the restoration of the area.

Commissioner Troy stated that this is a component of the application for Clean Ohio Program funds. District 7 will determine if they are recommended for the grant, and it requires a local resolution of support. The City of Mentor has already adopted a resolution.

Commissioner Troy asked for the time frame of the project?

Mr. Donaldson replied that grant applications are due by July 18 with the project beginning after the first of the

Commissioner Troy explained as previously stated at the public hearing last week, that local governments are required to pass a tax budget for Fiscal Year 2016 by July 15 of every year indicating what the intent is in terms

of levying taxpayer millage for the next year. The tax budget indicates that the same amount will be levied in the General Fund and the Child Welfare, Board of DD, ADAMHS Board, Narcotics Agency, Forensic Crime Lab and Senior Citizens Services are levying funds of similar amounts as the previous year. DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS:

<u>UTILITIES</u> - Mr. Matt Armand, Public Service Coordinator, reported that since the Department implemented the process of tracking customer service they received a 92% response rate as excellent or good. Mr. Armand thanked all the employees in the Department for doing an excellent job often during inclement weather and all hours of the day and night. These customers can be very irate. The employees make it their cause and their mission to give great customer service. Mr. Armand is proud of the Utilities employees.

Commissioner Troy stated that there were significant rain events before the fourth of July and he understood that the infrastructure held up well.

Mr. Armand stated that crews were out at 11:00 a.m. that Saturday and worked until noon on Sunday. There were nine customer complaints. He concurred that the infrastructure held up well and most of the complaints were stormwater related.

Commissioner Moran stated that to receive a 92% favorable response rate is commendable.

Mr. Armand replied that customer service is everyone's job and they all take it seriously and make it a core value in the Department.

COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR - Mr. Jason Boyd reported that tomorrow at 11:00 am there will be an emergency siren test conducted.

OLD BUSINESS: - none

NEW BUSINESS: - Commissioner Troy reported that the State Budget passed. The language regarding 50% reimbursement for public defenders for indigent defense remained in the budget. The tangible personal property tax on utilities was vetoed by the Governor. Funding to cover 85% of the cost of electronic poll books is still in the budget and expenditures will be reimbursable. They do not have to be bid out because four vendors will be provided to be determined by local Board of Elections. The County will wait to see what the allocation will be before ordering the new poll books. Special elections in February were eliminated and those entities requesting a special election throughout the year are required to pre-pay 65% of the cost of the election.

Commissioner Troy officially announced the resignation of Clerk Amy Elszasz and read a proclamation in her honor and wished her all the best in her future endeavors.

Ms. Elszasz thanked the Commissioners for their support and confidence over the years, and stated that it has been an honor and a privilege to work in the Commissioners Office. She wishes every citizen could have the unique perspective to witness the dedication and passion that the Commissioners display every day on behalf of the County.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Ms. Becky Lynch, 8040 King Memorial Drive in Mentor, asked about Resolution #15 and what non-general fund account increased appropriations and the reason behind the increase?

Mr. DiMare reported that it is a \$25.04 increase for the Lake County Soil and Water District to cover expenses

for selling a vehicle via an internet auction.

Commissioner Troy reported that the Commissioners received a request for permission from the Auditor's Office to utilize the Assembly Room for informal hearings with property owners to be held throughout the month of October 2015.

Commissioner Troy stated that the next regular Commissioners Meeting will be held on Thursday, July 16, 2015 at 10:00 a.m.

Commissioner Troy requested that the News-Herald update the Commissioners Meeting dates in the newspaper.
