CALL TO ORDER: Commissioner Hamercheck called the Meeting to order at 10:07 a.m. Thursday, March 3, 2022.

ROLL CALL: Upon roll being called, Commissioners: Plecnik, Young and Hamercheck were present.

<u>OPEN TO THE PUBLIC</u>: Commissioner Hamercheck asked if anyone in the audience wished to address the Board. Mr. John Muzik of 45 Coventry Drive in Painesville, expressed his concerns over the cost of gas and the effect it will have on the County department budgets.

Mr. Brian Massie of 8196 Rainbow Drive in Painesville, addressed Assistant Prosecutor David Hackman, asking if every elected official has an individual surety bond. Mr. Hackman replied that there was a change in the law a few years ago to roll elected official's bonds into the County insurance policy. Mr. Massie referred to item #1 on the agenda and addressed Sanitary Engineer, Mr. Randy Rothlisberger, asking why the resolution amount for the project was \$2,890,000 and the legal notice read \$2,300,000. Mr. Rothlisberger stated that the resolution includes the engineers estimated construction costs. Mr. Massie complimented the Sheriff on the purchase of gym equipment from a local company. He stated that two FBI agents came to his home last week.

Mr. Muzik thanked Commissioner Plecnik for his support of and work on the Utilities Senior Discount Program and thanked Commissioner Young for addressing the ongoing drug issues in Lake County.

Mr. John Muzik of 45 Coventry Drive in Painesville, spoke of the trips he has taken to Columbus and Washington and complimented the fine job that the Narcotics Bureau, Prosecutors and Judges do in Lake County.
