CALL TO ORDER: Commissioner Hamercheck called the Meeting to order at 10:07 a.m. Thursday, March 24, 2022.

ROLL CALL: Upon roll being called, Commissioners: Plecnik, Young and Hamercheck were present.

OPEN TO THE PUBLIC: Commissioner Hamercheck asked if anyone in the audience wished to address the Board.

Brian Massie of 8196 Rainbow Drive in Concord inquired if he missed the Budget Meeting for the Auditor's Office. Commissioner Hamercheck explained that it was canceled initially due to weather and later deemed unnecessary so they did not have one.

Mandy Orahood, Eric Cotton, Samantha Blu, and Stephanie Woodman Sufka from the Lake County Farm Bureau were present to recognize "National Agriculture Week" and presented the Board with a selection of locally grown items. They discussed the importance of agriculture in our county and how Lake County is #2 in the U.S. in revenue per acre. The Board expressed how grateful they are for the LCFB and reiterated how important it is, not only in our county but worldwide.
