Lake County Commissioners Declare November as National Adoption Month

PAINESVILLE, Ohio, October 20, 2022— National Adoption Month is recognized annually in November throughout the nation as a time to raise awareness about the urgent need for adoptive families for children and youth in foster care. At any given time, nearly 15,000 children in Ohio are being cared for away from their parents. While most of these children will eventually be reunited with biological family members, more than 3,000 children in the State of Ohio are currently waiting to be adopted and over 1,000 of them are teenagers.

"Our Department of Job and Family Services plays a crucial part in educating the public about foster and adoption," said Commissioner John Hamercheck. "Thank you to everyone who continues to make a difference."

The Lake County Department of Job and Family Services works diligently to ensure that there are safe and loving homes for Lake County's children. We offer open houses throughout the year where the community can learn more about the foster/adoptive process. Currently, Lake County has 39 licensed adoptive homes and have completed 14 adoptions in the last year.
