CALL TO ORDER: Commissioner Hamercheck called the Meeting to order at 10:07 a.m. Thursday, May 11, 2023.

ROLL CALL: Upon roll being called, Commissioners Plecnik, Regovich and Hamercheck were present.

<u>OPEN TO THE PUBLIC</u>: Commissioner Hamercheck asked if anyone in the audience wished to address the Board. Senior Services Director, Mrs. Alyea Barajas, was present to provide information on a new senior program entitled "Are You Ok". She explained that this new program for seniors is scheduled to launch in early July and will be housed with 211 at Lifeline, Inc. She stated that they are thankful to the Cleveland Federal Community Leadership Institute (CFCLI) for choosing senior services in Lake County as their community service project area, and to Lifeline, for their continued partnership. Mrs. Barajas explained that the mission of the CFCLI is to identify and develop leaders who are committed to advancing greater cooperation among Federal agencies and strengthening community partnerships. She thanked the CFCLI team: Ms. Suzanne Trocha from the U.S. Department of Defense, Mr. Bryan Traband from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, Mr. Nick Naugle, also from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, and Mr. Mike Power of the United States Coast Guard. She introduced Mr. Traband and Mr. Naugle to speak a bit on the program. They thanked Mrs. Barajas and Mrs. Kane for working so hard to assist them with this program.

Mr. Brian Massie of 8196 Rainbow Drive, referred to items # 13-15 pertaining to LakeTran Board reappointments. He stated that he would like the LakeTran Board to rescind the sales tax increase of 2019 and gave his reasons for this request. He stated that if they rescinded this increase, it would give the Board an opportunity to fund the jail and he explained his reasoning.

### JOB AND FAMILY SERVICES-none.

<u>COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR</u> – Mr. Jason Boyd briefly explained the creation of the Residential Appeals Board and thanked Chief Building Inspector, Mr. David Strichko, for his assistance. He explained that, in accordance with the Ohio Revised Code, the five-member board will meet on a needed basis and shall consist of the following: an Ohio Licensed attorney, an Ohio Registered Architect, an Ohio Registered Professional Engineer who is specialized in structural engineering, an Ohio Registered Professional Engineer who is specialized in mechanical engineering, and a discretionary appointment of the commissioners. He stated that candidates should submit their resumes to Clerk Jennifer Bell by July 1.

#### FINANCE - none.

<u>CLERK</u> – Commissioners Clerk, Ms. Jennifer Bell, stated that the next Regular Meeting is scheduled for Thursday, May 18, 2023 at 10:00 a.m.

### LEGAL – none.

<u>ENGINEER-</u>Mr. Gills did not have a report but Commissioner Hamercheck stated that the Engineer's Office continues to investigate every funding opportunity.

#### OLD BUSINESS: none.

<u>NEW BUSINESS</u>: Commissioner Hamercheck stated that he recently attended a Public Safety Committee Meeting and topics of discussion included Next Gen911, Local Government Funds, and indigent defense. He discussed several other topics included the OneOhio Region 13, and the Metropolitan Housing Authority. The Sheriff discussed some major incidents that have been occurring around the County and wanted to express his gratitude to County Police, Fire Emergency, and Dispatchers for how well everyone works together. He also discussed several disaster training sessions they have done.

The Board expressed their support for all safety forces.

<u>PUBLIC COMMENT</u>: Commissioner Hamercheck asked if anyone in the audience wished to address the Board. Mr. Marty Hiller, Director of the Free Clinic, announced that they will be having a grand opening and ribbon cutting of their new facility.

Mr. Michael Paul of Mentor, expressed his support of all law enforcement.

Mr. John Muzik of Painesville Township, provided the Board with an update on Title 42 and immigration.

Mr. Brian Massie, on behalf of his group Lobbyists for Citizens, provided an update about what his group is doing to address pandering of obscene materials in public schools.

Mr. John Marra of Timberlake, discussed his concerns with NOACA in detail with the Board. He also addressed County Administrator Boyd offering his thoughts on the HOK contract.

Mr. Chris Weiss of Leroy discussed his thoughts on jail funding and referred to an article he saw in the Tribune. The Board and Mr. Weiss continued to discuss the jail, jail funding and capital projects. Commissioner Plecnik stressed that he is against any tax increases ever.

<u>EXECUTIVE SESSION</u>: On a motion by Commissioner Plecnik, seconded by Regovich, the Board convened an Executive Session at 11:30 a.m. to discuss Real Estate-Acquisition with the vote as follows: "AYES Commissioners: Plecnik, Regovich and Hamercheck "NAYS": None.
