

Training Provider/Program List

Access to training services will be provided after a client's "Appropriateness" has been established. The process of establishing appropriateness consists of several factors and steps. Laws, rules and policies established because of the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) require that in order to receive training services, participants must:

- A. be unable or be judged as unable to obtain or retain employment through core and intensive services;
- B. be determined in need of training after an individual interview, evaluation, or assessment and development of comprehensive Individual Employability Plan;
- C. have the skills and qualifications to successfully participate in a specific program of training (prior employment record, previous educational outcomes and additional occupational assessments may be required);
- D. select a program of training services that are directly linked to the employment opportunities in the local area involved or in other areas in which the individual is willing to relocate; and
- E. be unable to obtain other grant assistance for training or require assistance beyond the assistance made available under other grant programs including Pell Grant funds. WIOA is a funding source of last resort.

The following list of training providers and programs **may** be available to participants who have established appropriateness for training services. Lake County Job and Family Services is the Fiscal Agent for WIOA funding in Local Workforce #5 (Lake County) and as such reserves the right to determine what program will be funded on a case by case basis.

Emphasis is always placed on funding the most basic level of training that has been determined to qualify candidates for (only) in-demand occupations. In other words, degree tracks will not be funded when a related certificate track will qualify a successful student for employment in an occupational field. In addition, training providers may fall out of good standing at any given time for noncompliance with their Training Provider Vendor Agreement at which time their programs cannot be funded.

In-demand occupations are established by the Ohio Office of Workforce Development who maintains a list of in- demand occupations. The list is dynamic, and changes are based on documented job openings and other current and projected employment factors.
