Local Agricultural Easement Purchase Program

Lake County Soil & Water Conservation District (SWCD) will receive funding from the Ohio Department of Agriculture to preserve farmland in Lake County for the 2022 funding round of the Local Agricultural Easement Purchase Program (LAEPP).

The LAEPP pays farmland owners to voluntarily place an agricultural easement upon their farm to preserve it as a working farm forever. The program provides an opportunity for landowners who love their land to be compensated for extinguishing the "development rights" and be reassured that the farm will always BE a farm. The land stays under private ownership.

To qualify, farms must be more than 40 acres, actively engaged in farming and enrolled in the Current Agricultural Use Valuation (CAUV) and Agricultural District programs. A small farm exception is an option for landowners with less than 40 acres if they are adjacent to other permanently protected properties. Landowners may use the proceeds of the easement in any way they wish, but most reinvest it in their farm operation.

Since the Agricultural Easement Purchase Program (predecessor to the Local Agricultural Easement Purchase Program) began in 2002, Lake SWCD has worked with interested landowners to establish easements on 11 farms, preserving a total of 497 acres in North Perry Village, Madison Township and Leroy Township.

The 2022 application period runs from January 18, 2022 through March 31, 2022. Interested landowners should contact Lake SWCD to make an application. If the applicant farm is not currently enrolled in the CAUV or Ag District programs, the landowner must make an application with the Lake County Auditor before the first Monday in March in order to qualify for the 2022 funding.

Bareroot Trees and Shrubs available in quantities of 5, 10 or 25

WHITE PINE

Pinus strobus

When planted in a row or grouping, this conifer species will grow quickly, form a privacy screen or windbreak and will do well in many soil types.

CANAAN FIR

Abies balsamea var. phanerolipsis

Want to start your own Christmas tree grove? This rare-in-the-wild subspecies is native to isolated pockets in the mountains of WV and VA. This densely needled fir is great for windbreaks and privacy screening.

WHITE CEDAR

Thuja occidentalis

Can be trained to form a hedge or planted in a windbreak. This evergreen provides excellent cover for wildlife. Prefers sunny, well-drained sites.

AMERICAN BASSWOOD

Tilia americana

Stately American basswood would be a great replacement for lost ash trees. Its spring flowers produce copious nectar earning it the nickname "bee-tree" Honey made from basswood foraging bees is mild and complex. Likes sunny, moist to well-drained sites.

SILVER MAPLE

Acer saccharinum

This species will make short work of establishing shade along a stream bank or that wet spot in your yard. Provides a source of leaf litter and is a favorite nesting tree of orioles, but not of deer or gypsy moths.

BLACK GUM

Nyssa sylvatica

Glossy, dark green leaves turn yellow, orange, brilliant red and purple. The bluish-black fruit is loved by many birds. Tolerates a wide range of soils and light conditions. Also available as #2 container.

AMERICAN SYCAMORE

Platanus occidentalis

The white bark of this tree species is a year-round indicator of the wettest landscape spots. This tree will grow quickly and can eventually reach 120' Also available as #2 container.

SHUMARD OAK

Quercus shumardii

Plant for the future with this Southwest Ohio native member of the red oak group. Shumard oaks are very similar to Northern Red Oaks, but they are faster growing and more tolerant of air pollution, poor drainage, compacted soil and drought. This makes them a great choice for a shade tree in your yard.

COMMON CHOKECHERRY

Prunus virginiana

This small tree to large suckering shrub has remarkable wildlife value, beautiful spring blossoms, red berries in the summer and yellow to orange leaves in

→ PAWPAW

Asimina triloba

Known for its banana-like September fruits, large tropical-looking leaves and unique, rich red flowers, this tree provides 3 seasons of delight. Also available as #3 container.

DOWNY SERVICEBERRY

Amelanchier arborea

This small native understory tree makes a great replacement for the invasive Bradford or Callery pear! Beautiful almost lacy-looking April blooms followed by tasty berries in June.

→ PAGODA DOGWOOD

Cornus alternifolia

This small understory tree has fragrant springtime flower clusters and fall berries. It is a low maintenance tree that tolerates a variety of soil types and light conditions, but prefers shady afternoons.

→ DWARF BUSH HONEYSUCKLE

Diervilla Ionicera

This Ohio native honeysuckle has beautiful yellow blooms. Makes a great addition to a small hedge or shrub border. Tolerates full sun to part shade and average to drier soils. Also available as #3 container.

NORTHERN BAYBERRY

Myrica pensylvanica

This tall dense-branching deciduous shrub has narrow, leathery, grayish-green leaves and waxy berries that are sure to attract birds. It is salt tolerant too! Also available as #2 container.

→ BEBB'S WILLOW

Salix bebbiana

Like many willows, this species can have one or many trunks. Perfect for planting in wetlands and soggy spots, along pond edges and streambanks.

✓ VIRGINIA SWEETSPIRE

Itea virginica

This mound-shaped shrub has beautiful drooping spires of fragrant white flowers in early summer. Its leaves turn a brilliant crimson in fall. And create a stunning display when massed. #3 container. 18" shrub.

ALLEGHENY SERVICEBERRY

Amelanchier laevis

This small native understory tree makes a great replacement for the invasive Bradford or Callery pear! Beautiful almost lacy-looking April blooms followed by tasty berries in June. #3 container. 15-18" clump.

SWEETFERN

Comptonia peregina

Despite its name and fernlike foliage, this curious, small, woody, colony-forming shrub is not a fern. It thrives in dry, sandy, and acidic soils. It even tolerates salt. Its foliage smells sweet and fragrant when crushed. Due to this it is largely avoided by deer and other herbivoires. #2 container, 12-15" clump.

✓ YELLOWROOT

Xanthorhiza simplicissima

A mat-like, small, spreading shrub with erect, leggy stems. The bark and long roots are deep-yellow and bitter. Attractive foliage is glossy and green, turning yellow to reddish-purple in fall. Many tan-colored leaves persist into winter. The small, star-shaped, purplishbrown flowers are in crowded, terminal clusters. 1 quart container, clump.

✓ LIZARD'S TAIL

Saururus cernuus

The common name refers to the long, finger-like flowers that appear on this perennial during the summer months. Great as a spreading groundcover in moist soils and saturated. Good for wetland gardens and habitat. Can colonizes large areas. 10" square container, clump.

▲ LUCERNE BLUE EYED GRASS

Sisyrinchium angustifolium 'Lucerne'

Growing up to 1', this wildflower forms tufted clumps of narrow sword shaped leaves. Starry bright blue flowers rise appear in late spring. This diminutive beauty prospers in sunny or lightly shaded gardens with moist to well-drained soils. #1 container, clump.

FRINGED SEDGE

This shiny, evergreen, sunny sedge forms large colonies in moist to saturated soils. In late spring drooping bristly flower spikelets top the gracefully shaggy foliage. Golden brown seed clusters follow.#1 container, clump.

OSTRICH FERN

Matteuccia struthiopteris

This fern has large, vase-shaped, fronds. Excellent for naturalizing streams and damp woodland edges. Tolerant of a wide range of soils. The emerging

fiddlehead shoots are considered a delicacy when cooked. #2 container, clump.

RAIN BARREL Start collecting rain this spring with a 55-gallon barrel and DIY diverter kit. Individual barrels, diverter kits, and linking kits are also

There may be additional seedlings and conservation gifts for sale on pick-up day. Walk-ins are welcome (and encouraged!) but subject to availability.

Lake SWCD cannot guarantee their survival after distribution. Planting instructions and species information will be provided when you pick up vour trees


