# **Trees and Shrubs**

bareroot and container (when listed)

#### WHITE PINE

Pinus strobus

When planted in a row or grouping, this conifer species will grow quickly, form a privacy screen or windbreak and will do well in many soil types.

# NORTHERN WHITE CEDAR

Thuja occidentalis

Can be trained to form a hedge or planted in a windbreak. This evergreen provides excellent cover for wildlife. Prefers sunny, well-drained sites.

#### **CULTIVAR**

Thuja occidentalis 'Holmstrup'

This cultivar is narrow, compact and conical, and holds a dark green color througout the winter. Available as #5 container.

**EASTERN RED CEDAR** 

Juniperus virginiana

Can be trained to form a hedge or planted in a windbreak. This evergreen provides excellent cover for wildlife. Prefers sunny, well-drained sites.

#### AMERICAN BASSWOOD Tilia americana

Frequently planted along city streets, the stately American Basswood would be a great replacement for lost ash trees. Its spring flowers produce copious nectar earning them the nickname "bee-tree".

Likes sunny, moist to well-drained sites.

# **BIGTOOTH ASPEN**

Populus grandidentata

This species is capable of growing on a wide range of sites. It is fast growing and short lived. It spreads by seed as well as by root suckering, which is important to keep in mind when siting.

# **BLACK GUM**

Nyssa sylvatica

Glossy, dark green leaves turn yellow, orange, brilliant red and purple. The bluish-black fruit is loved by many birds. Tolerates a wide range of soils and light conditions.

# **BUTTERNUT**

Juglans cinerea

Also called White Walnut, this species is slow-growing and somewhat short lived. It is valued for its nuts more than timber. It grows well on a wide variety of sunny sites.

# **COMMON PERSIMMON**

Diospyros virginiana

This tree has an attractive form, beautiful chunky bark and offers sweet orange fruits after the first hard frost.

# ALLEGHENY SERVICEBERRY

#### Amelanchier laevis

660

This small native understory tree makes a great replacement for the invasive Bradford or Callery pear! Beautiful almost lacy-looking April blooms are followed by tasty berries in June.

#### **APPLE SERVICEBERRY CULTIVARS**

Amelanchier x grandiflora 'Autumn Brilliance'

Amelanchier x grandiflora 'Ballerina'

Apple serviceberry is a hybrid cross between two North American serviceberry species, namely, A. arborea (Downy serviceberry) and A. laevis (Allegheny serviceberry). These cultivars are excellent choices for landscape interest. Available as #2 container.

#### **COMMON CHOKECHERRY**

#### Prunus virginiana

This small tree to large suckering shrub has remarkable wildlife value, beautiful spring blossoms, red berries in the summer and yellow to orange leaves in the fall.

# WAFER ASH

Ptelea trifoliata

This understory tree or large shrub is not a true ash. It is a larval host for several butterflies, including the giant swallowtail (Papilio cresphontes). Birds and pollinators are also attracted to its flowers and fruit. As an added benefit this tree is highly deer resistant. Also available as #3 container.

# **MUSCLEWOOD**

Carpinus caroliniana

This interesting understory tree has trunks that resemble lean muscles and hop-like fruits. Also available as #2 container.

# REDBUD

Cercis canadensis  $\mathbf{\mathfrak{B}}$ 

Most famous for its spring branches which are covered in pink-purple flowers. This well behaved shade-loving tree is a perfect landscape tree as it rarely grows larger than 20'. Also available as #2 container.

# **BLACK ELDERBERRY**

Sambucus canadensis

This plant would be equally at home next to a pond, in a sunny hedge or as a specimen in your partially sunny backyard. The tiny black berries are loved by birds and can also be used to make jelly, syrup and pies.

#### **CULTIVAR**

Sambucus canadensis 'John's' is available as #5 container.



#### Symphoricarpos orbiculatus

This shrub's pink berries stand out against leafless branches in winter. It also has dainty pinkish flowers in spring. This shrub spreads by root suckers and can form a thicket if allowed. It thrives on neglect and poor soils and is great for controlling erosion on slopes, and riparian plantings.

# **MEADOWSWEET**

Spiraea alba

This 2-4' tall, suckering shrub grows well in moist soil. It has white-colored spikes of flowers from mid-summer to early autumn. Good for ponds and low spots in the landscape. With watering it also makes a nice low hedge! Also available as #3 container.

# Sambucus racemosa

This shade-loving shrub plant loves moist, rocky soils. It is one of the first shrubs to bloom in spring. While it can grow to 15', half of that is more common. The clusters of tiny red berries are loved by birds, but unpalatable to humans.

# **RED OSIER DOGWOOD**



Swida sericea (formerly Cornus) This multi-stemmed shrub will be at home in a wet part of your yard. It will put on a show of white flowers in the spring, white fruits in the fall and its namesake red bark in the winter.

#### CULTIVAR

Swida sericea 'Bailei' is available as #5 container.

# SHINING SUMAC





This large shrub or small tree loves a sunny spot and tolerates rocky poor soils. It has red purple berries and brilliant red leaves in fall. Similar in appearance to the closely related staghorn sumac, but without fuzzy branches and slightly smaller.

#### CULTIVAR

Rhus copallinum var latifolia 'Morton' Prairie Flame™

This is noted for its compact size, glossy green summer foliage and spectacular red fall color. It is a male cultivar (plants are dioecious) that does not produce fruiting clusters. Available as a #3 container.

#### SWAMP ROSE

#### Rosa palustris

This shrub can be used as a hedge or trained to climb a wall or trellis. Highly-fragrant, pink, spring blossoms and red rose hips in fall add interest to your landscape. Prefers wet areas, such as around ponds, streams, ditches and low spots.

# SWEETFERN

#### Comptonia peregina

Despite its name and fernlike foliage, this curious, small, woody, colony-forming shrub is not a fern. It thrives in dry, sandy, and acidic soils. It even tolerates salt. Its foliage smells sweet and fragrant when crushed. Due to this it is largely avoided by deer and other herbivoires. *Also available as #2 container*.

#### SWEETSHRUB

#### Calycanthus floridus

Also called Carolina Allspice, this understory, shade-loving shrub has beautiful maroon to magenta tropical looking blooms that smell of pineapple, strawberry and banana. It will tolerate a wide range of soils, but thrives in rich soils. *Also available as #5 container.* 

# **Container Perennials**

Container sizes and approximate height listed.

#### **CORAL HONEYSUCKLE CULTIVARS**

Lonicera sempervirens

Also called trumpet or scarlet honeysuckle, this species is a vigorous, deciduous, twining vine which typically grows 10-15' (less frequently to 20') and is one of the showiest of the vining honeysuckles.

#### **BLANCHE SANDMAN HONEYSUCKLE**

Lonicera sempervirens 'Blanche Sandman' - Vigorous grower with vibrant orange-red flowers from late May until frost. More resistant to aphids than other varieties and highly attractive to hummingbirds.

#### MAJOR WHEELER HONEYSUCKLE

*Lonicera sempervirens 'Major Wheeler'* – This profuse blooming native honeysuckle is covered with a continuous display of red orange flowers from late spring through the end of summer. The crisp green foliage remains clean and resistant to mildew. A hummingbird magnet. Selected from a native.

These will be sold as #3 trellised containers.

#### **NEW YORK FERN**

Thelypteris noveboracensis

This mostly evergreen fern grows in clumps and its blades are distinctive as they taper sharply at both the base and the tip. It can spread rapidly, but is relatively easy to control, making it a popular fern for gardens. *Available as #1 clump*.

# EASTERN STAR WOOD SEDGE

Carex radiata

Native to moist woodlands, this is an attractive species that makes a graceful fountain of bright green, extremely fine foliage. Makes an outstanding mass planting, border, or use mixed with woodland wildflowers or other plants in a damp shaded area. *Available as 8" squat container.* 

# **Other Conservation Goods**

**RAIN BARREL** Start collecting rain this spring with a 55-gallon barrel and DIY diverter kit. Individual barrels, diverter kits, and linking kits are also available.

**TREE TUBE SHELTERS** 2' plastic tubes to protect your tree seedlings. Vented to allow for dormancy.

**TREE FLAGS** White flags on wire to help minimize mower causalities.

**SOIL TEST KITS** Soil test kits from Penn State, measure soil nutrients and organic matter.

**NATIVE WILDFLOWER SEED** These native wildflower and grass mixes from OPN Seed are great for bringing diversity and wildlife habitat to your property.
