Lake County Department of Utilities Revisions to the Rules and Regulations 2020 Executive Summary

The Lake County Department of Utilities has completed its annual review of our Rules and Regulations. As a result of our review there were several changes to the document to correct minor errors, such as typographic errors and minor clarifications, and more importantly to better define the way the Utilities Department does business. Changes highlighted in Red are deleted and changes made in Blue are additions.

- 1. Page 1-55, Section 1, Sanitary Sewer Service Connections. Deleted entire section "C". Lateral extensions will be treated as a case per case item.
- 2. Page 7-5, Section 7, Fee Schedule. Delete "Lateral Extension Deposit". This is a case by case item and should be removed from the fee schedule.
- 3. Page 1-42, Section 1, 1.37 and 1.46, Water and Sanitary Wastewater Treatment Plant Capacity Fee calculations. Last year we changed our procedure for calculating capacity fees. This change will clear up some situations that we did not anticipate.
- 4. Page 2-4, Section 2, Materials. Added the use of PVCO to the approved material for water pipe installations.
- 5. Figure 2.22.2, Flexible Trench and Bedding detail. For C909 PVC waterline only. Created a figure drawing for clarification.
- 6. Page 3-13, Section 3. Service Connections. Added HDPE DR11 after PVC schedule 120. It is mentioned in other sections of the Rules and Regulations as an option.
- 7. Page 3-34, Section 3.21 Number 3. Added verbiage regarding the pipe lining.
- 8. Page1-1, Section 1, Definitions. Added Backwater device to definitions as it is in section 3 under connection procedures.
- 9. Page 3-14, Section 3, 3.09A, Service Connections. Added language for backwater valves. Incorporating backwater devices as an approved material.
- 10. Figure 3.21.1, Backwater Valve Assembly. Added figure drawing showing location of backwater valve location.

- 11. Page7-5, Section 7, Fee Schedule. Increase rental meter deposits. The current cost for a 1" rental meter deposit is \$200.00 and a 1.5" rental meter is \$1000.00. 1" rental meter increase to \$500.00 and 1.5" rental meter to \$1500.00. Prices do not include water use, hydrant wrench, and monthly fee if the device is not returned. This will allow us to replace rental meters that are never returned at cost.
- 12. Figure 3.8.1, Outside drop connection for new manholes. Edited description text.
